Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome back to Silver Tree for the beginning of the 2017 school year. I would especially like to give a warm welcome to any new families and children to our beautiful school, I am sure you will enjoy your time with us now and into the future.

Welcome back to Megan Carter who began her journey with the Class 1 children last Wednesday morning in a beautiful ceremony at the assembly. Also new to staff is Danielle Passmore who will be working with Megan in Class 1 and Carmen Renz our new German teacher, welcome to Silver Tree! Not new to staff but in other positions around the school this year are Kristy Brookes in Class 6 on Fridays, Karolina Pawlowski in Class 5 on Fridays and Class 4 on Wednesday afternoons and Robyn Smith in the new position of Educational Support. We farewell Kayla Bayfield from the front office reception desk after nearly two years in the position and wish her all the very best in her future endeavours. We have appointed Emily Stanton-Clements in a temporary capacity in the position until we complete the process for choosing a new receptionist, welcome and thank you, Emily.

Many of you may have noticed, as you returned to school, there were a few changes around the grounds that have enhanced the play areas for the children. A huge thank you to Marijanna, Fiona and Jesse Cowan for their amazing work and for making this all happen during the holidays in time for the return of the children. There will be many other projects on the go this year that will certainly improve school infrastructure. The most significant is the construction of a Multipurpose Building that will incorporate music tuition rooms and toilets for the upper primary classes. The building will be paid for through the acquisition of a government grant and low interest loan as well as school funds and will be situated where the temporary upper school toilets are. It is an exciting time for the school and will significantly improve the facilities and what we can offer to the school community.

The teaching faculty were concerned towards the end of last year about the lack of close parental supervision of very young children both during school hours and after school. The Faculty and Administration ask parents to adhere to some imperatives, outlined below, concerning the use of the school grounds. On the whole most families pick their children up and leave on time at the end of the day and this is wonderful, we ask all other parents to please support the concerns of the teaching faculty on the issues surrounding this extremely important duty of care and safety requirement.

- Parents helping at school during school time need to be closely watching younger siblings as there is a safety issue with older children on the hardcourt and around the play areas during recess and lunch times.
- After school was becoming an issue despite parents being informed and reminded of supervision. Previously the school was wanting to provide a community environment for parents after school but faculty feel that due to 'duty of care' responsibilities this is no longer possible. Incidents have occurred leaving teachers feeling uncomfortable about adequate parental supervision.
- Children should not be playing with sports equipment before or after school.
- Parents and children should leave school premises before or at 3.30pm, the school should not be used as an out of school hour's playground.

EARLY CHILDHOOD CHATTER

Welcome Back Everyone!

What a beautiful start to the term. It was so lovely to see all our Kindy families at the picnic, with children reacquainting themselves with each other in the playgrounds, rolling, tumbling, digging and swinging. It was beautiful to see many fond greetings being shared between teachers and assistants and the children also.

The weather has been very kind to us so far, even so the sun is still strong. Please remember to apply sunscreen before kindy and this will be sufficient to last all morning. Also please remember spare light clothing and a plastic bag for wet clothes from water play or accidents.

Our first parent meeting was a wonderful sharing time about how to help the children settle in Kindergarten. Many wonderful points and stories were shared, which illustrated there is never just one way. But rhythm and consistency helps enormously, as it does in our Kindy day.

Woylies will be starting on Wednesday morning, some parents will be staying, however if you have not arranged anything with your teacher, please remember a short goodbye and leave when you say you will without looking back is helpful for your child. Let them get settled with their teacher/assistant outside before morning recorder and before we all move inside. Show love and trust in the Kindergarten and teachers and that will resonate with the children also. Know that we will ring you if needed. Stay at the coffee shop for 20 minutes and if we haven't called, everything is fine.

Another gem from the meeting we wanted to share with all, is remember not to talk too much to your child about the Kindy day. If you are pummelled with questions remember to keep the magic of wonder and discovery for the children by just saying with a twinkle in your eye, "Ooooo I wonder". The children begin to be familiar with the rhythm through their experiences and their wonder continues to live within them every day.

The Rainbows all had a really lovely time together for their first Friday Rainbow Day. They all coped really well, with many very excited to finally be the Rainbows who get to play at Marri Kindy!! Play both inside and outside already showed the children making new friendships across the Kindergarten groups. This, as well as every Friday (not including mid-term break on March 3rd), will be Rainbow morning at Marri Kindy.

Please put Thursday March 23rd in your diaries for our Autumn Festival gathering at Kindergarten. This will be the Thursday closest to the Autumn Equinox instead of Easter this year. 

SCHOOL CARPARK

A reminder to Parents and Guardians that parking bays within the school are marked in **white**. The **yellow** bays are **pick up or drop off** only and parents should not leave their cars if parked in this zone.

For the safety of your child and other children, please refrain from parking or dropping off on the turning circle. All children should be entering the school via the front gate or the gate situated at the drop off zone. **The speed limit whilst within school property is 10 km/h.**

The top car parking area is for **teachers and staff only**. If there is an overflow in the carpark area the bottom paddock can be used. It is a matter of safety for our children that everyone abides by these simple rules. If someone other than the Parent or Guardian is to pick up children, please make them aware of the rules.


