## GEMS NEWS

### KWOBIDAK MERENY BOODJA-K - a new name and more funding for our bush tucker garden.

Last year, parents designed and built a raised garden bed in the shape of the Wagyl. This project involved the selection of fallen branches and rocks and soil for construction, mulching, and planting bush tucker species as part of primary school gardening classes. Local endemic species of bush tucker plants that have nutritional, medicinal and/or cultural significance to aboriginal people were selected and interpretative signage describing the aboriginal name and use of each plant was commissioned.

Unfortunately due to extreme weather conditions over summer, many of our plants where lost. Luckily, GEM's was the successful recipient of another PALS grant of \$750 for 2014. This has meant we have been able to replant species we lost, and to plant 3 additional species and develop additional signage.

Significantly, we have also been able to design a new wooden sign for the garden. A local Noongar elder has named our bush tucker garden *Kwobidak Mereny Boodja-k*. This can be literally translated into "beautiful food from the earth". A beautiful name and exactly what we are aiming to achieve during our weekly gardening classes!

Special thanks go to the Department of Aboriginal Affairs for funding this project once again, to Donna Bieundurry for facilitating the naming of the garden, to Ben Avery, Pete Ballard and Marijanna Smith for their help in building and carving the sign, to Charles Snelleksz-Mathelot for digging holes for the sign and planting the new plants with the students and to Steve Mossman for his donation of paint for the sign. If you missed the new sign at Open Day, take the opportunity this week to admire it!

#### COURSE - How to Dramatise Your Story Through Narrative Structure Saturday 27th September 1.30-4.30pm - Mattie Furphy House

Narrative structure is about choices, and about writing your novel, short story or script in scenes. These choices hinge not only upon the integration of the story and the plot (which are subtly different) and the voice and point of view of your characters, but also upon the sequence of the scenes; in other words, do you start your narrative at the beginning, the middle, or the end? Should you start even *after* the dénouement? The choices you make about your characters and your story's sequence, plus the way you conceive and develop your scenes, is the subject of this course. A well-organised and cohesive narrative structure need not be chronological nor follow any prescribed template. It is malleable, and so long as it is well integrated, can be unusual... even unique. Understanding narrative structure will give your work cohesion, logical progression and readability, while also conferring artistic form on the structure. Its effective use can also make the difference between your manuscripts being rejected or becoming a best seller.
