Dear Parents,

This week I attended a meeting at the Shire of Mundaring with the Principals from schools in our local area. We received some information from guest speakers, including the Shire of Mundaring CEO who presented a snapshot of the changes to local government and the proposed merger with City of Swan. The Shire are holding an information forum on Wednesday evening at 6pm for interested residents. Please contact the Shire if you are interested in attending. There was also an opportunity to hear updates from the schools about projects they are currently involved in and much discussion around the projected early childhood enrolments for 2014. I am pleased to report that Silver Tree has a very healthy number of Kindy enrolments for next year (and subsequent years) and so our attention returns to the planned building of additional classrooms. We have received the very pleasing news that Silver Tree's application for a Capital Grant towards a new primary classroom has been approved, with this building scheduled to be in use by 2015.

Last week our Primary classes were treated to a musical performance by the Perth Waldorf School Orchestra, and what a spectacular performance it was! It was wonderful for the Silver Tree children to see Paul and his orchestra and there were a few familiar (ex-Silver Tree) faces in the crowd. The music was beautiful and the performance made all that more interesting by the musicians explaining and demonstrating the various instruments. It was fantastic to have so many parents in the audience to share the experience with. I'm sure that the Silver Tree strings students were inspired to continue their daily practice!

A little light inside me turns*



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## RECIPE OF THE WEEK

### *Spiced Lentil Stuffed Capsicums*

#### **Ingredients:**

4 medium red capsicums  
20g butter  
1 celery stick, trimmed & thinly sliced  
1 leek trimmed & thinly sliced  
2 garlic cloves crushed  
3 tsp ground cumin  
1 tsp ground coriander  
400g can brown lentils (or fresh lentils cooked, drained & softened)  
400g can diced tomatoes (or fresh)  
1tsp vegetable stock powder  
1/3 cup flat leafed parsley, chopped  
3 tsp olive oil  
Plain Greek yogurt to serve

#### **Method:**

Preheat oven to 180 degrees, line a roasting pan with baking paper. Slice tops from capsicums & reserve. Scoop out seeds & membrane. Stand capsicums in prepared pan.

Melt butter in non - stick frying pan over medium heat. Add celery and leek. Cook for 1 -2 minutes or until aromatic. Add lentils, tomatoes, stock powder and half a cup of cold water. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 5 - 10 minutes or until sauce thickens. Remove from heat.

Add parsley and season with salt and pepper. Spoon warm lentil mixture into capsicums, place capsicum lids over filling. Drizzle with oil. Bake for 45 - 50 minutes or until capsicums have softened and skins begin to blister. Place capsicums on serving plates, gently lifts lids and top each with a dollop of yogurt. Replace lids and serve.
